The following items were on the agenda:

1. Approval of minutes from last month's meeting
2. COA for signage at 615-A Main Street, application from Marcus A. Coker for Momentum Dance Concepts.
3. COA for signage at 12 South 7th St., application from Lisa Jackson for Art from the Heart.
4. COA for signage at 409 Main Street, application from Crawford County Sheriff Dept.
5. COA for signage at 615-B Main Street, application from Auston Butler for The Toy Soldier Shop.

Chairman Dwight Hopkins called the meeting to order. Roy Hebard made the motion to approve minutes from the last meeting as written, Vickie Davis seconded the motion, motion carried a unanimous vote.

First item in front of the Committee was a COA for signage at 615-A Main Street. After some discussion, motion was made by Roy Hebard that this work would have no impact on the surrounding structures. This motion was seconded by Vickie Davis, and the motion carried a unanimous decision. Next Roy Hebard made a motion to approve COA, and Vickie Davis seconded the motion. The motion carried a unanimous vote.

Next item was COA by Lisa Jackson for signage and to paint store front at 12 South 7th Street. A motion was made by Vickie Davis and seconded by Roy Hebard that the work would have no impact on surrounding structures. The motion carried a unanimous decision. A motion was then made to approve the COA by Dwight Hopkins, and motion was given a second by Roy Hebard. The motion carried a unanimous decision.

Next COA was for 409 Main Street for signage, application made by Crawford County Sheriff's Dept. A motion was made by Dwight Hopkins that the COA would have no impact on the surrounding property. This motion was seconded by Roy Hebard and carried a unanimous vote. Motion was made by Vickie Davis to approve COA, motion was seconded by Roy Hebard, and the motion carried a unanimous decision.

Next COA reviewed was one for signage for 615-B Main Street by Austin Butler for the Toy Soldier. Dwight Hopkins made a motion that the work would have no impact on the surrounding buildings, and motion was seconded by Roy Hebard. After some discussion, a motion was made by Vickie Davis to approve the COA. The motion was seconded by Roy Hebard and motion was carried with a unanimous vote.

The final COA reviewed by the Committee was for 511 Main St. from Tiffany Huffman, for signage. A motion was made by Dwight Hopkins that the work being done would not affect the surrounding structures, and motion was seconded by Vickie Davis. After reviewing the information before them, a motion was made to approve the COA by Roy Hebard. The motion was seconded by Vickie Davis. The motion carried a unanimous vote.

With no other business before the Committee, this meeting was adjourned.
